| Respondent Type | Total | Total Responding to $\geq 75\%$ of questions |

| People with disabilities and those responding on their behalf | 844 | 534 |
| Transportation providers | 381 | 232 |
| Professional caretakers and members of advocacy groups and agencies serving Ohioans with disabilities | 1,342 | 644 |
| Total | 2,251* | 1,313* |

Figure 11: Percentage of respondents with disabilities who had personal access to a car or other motor vehicle

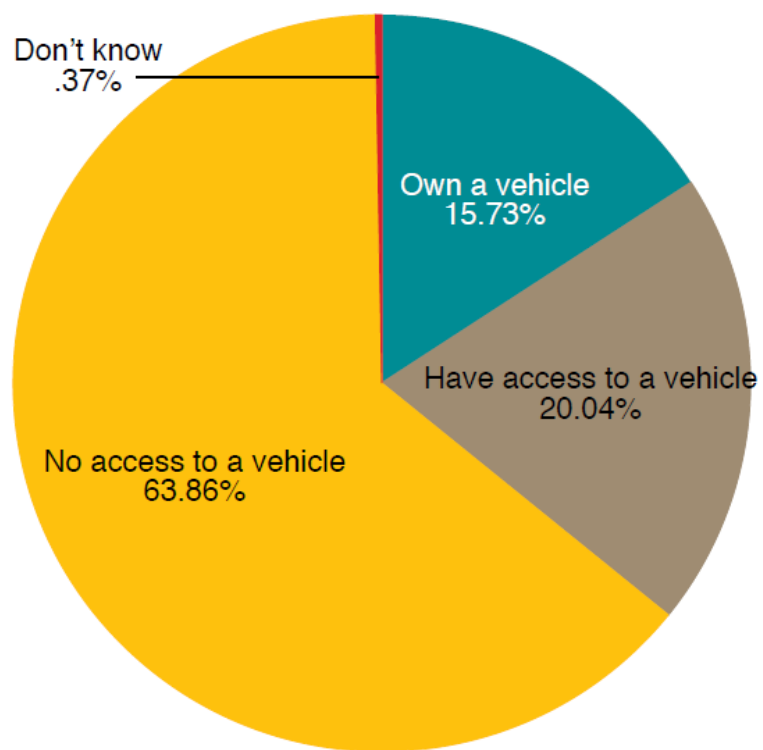
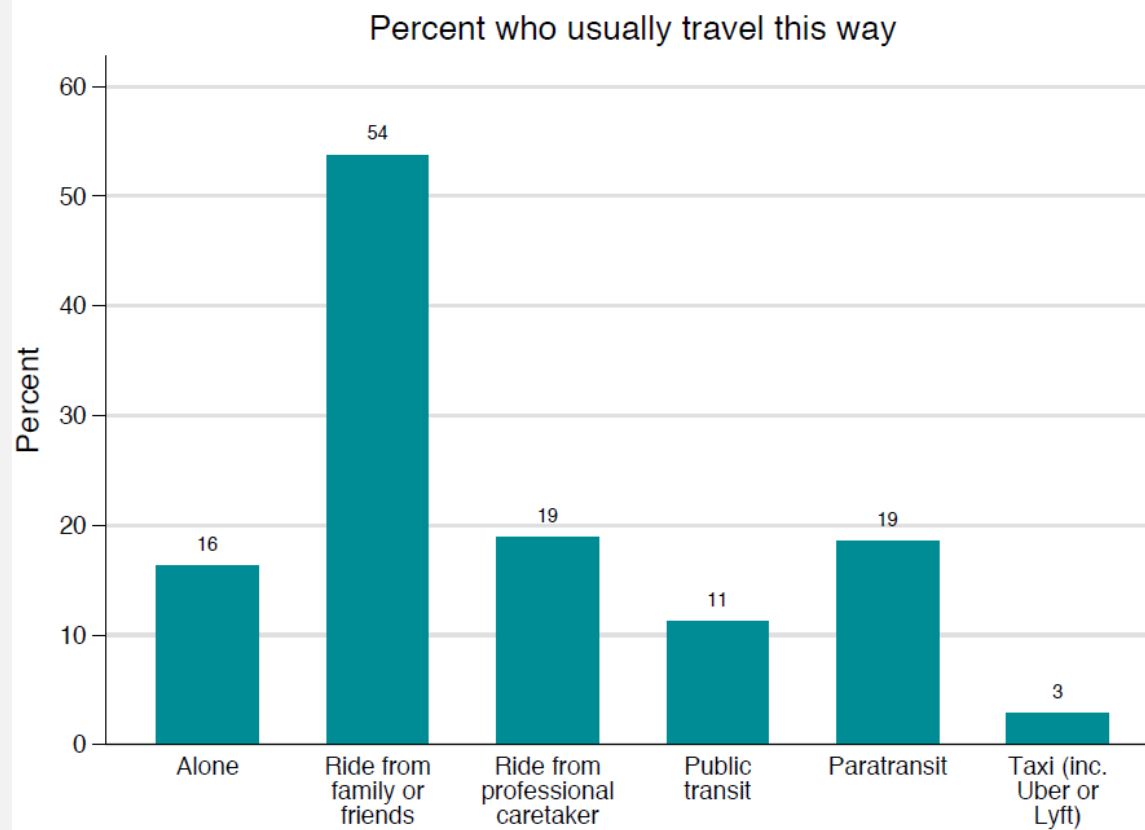
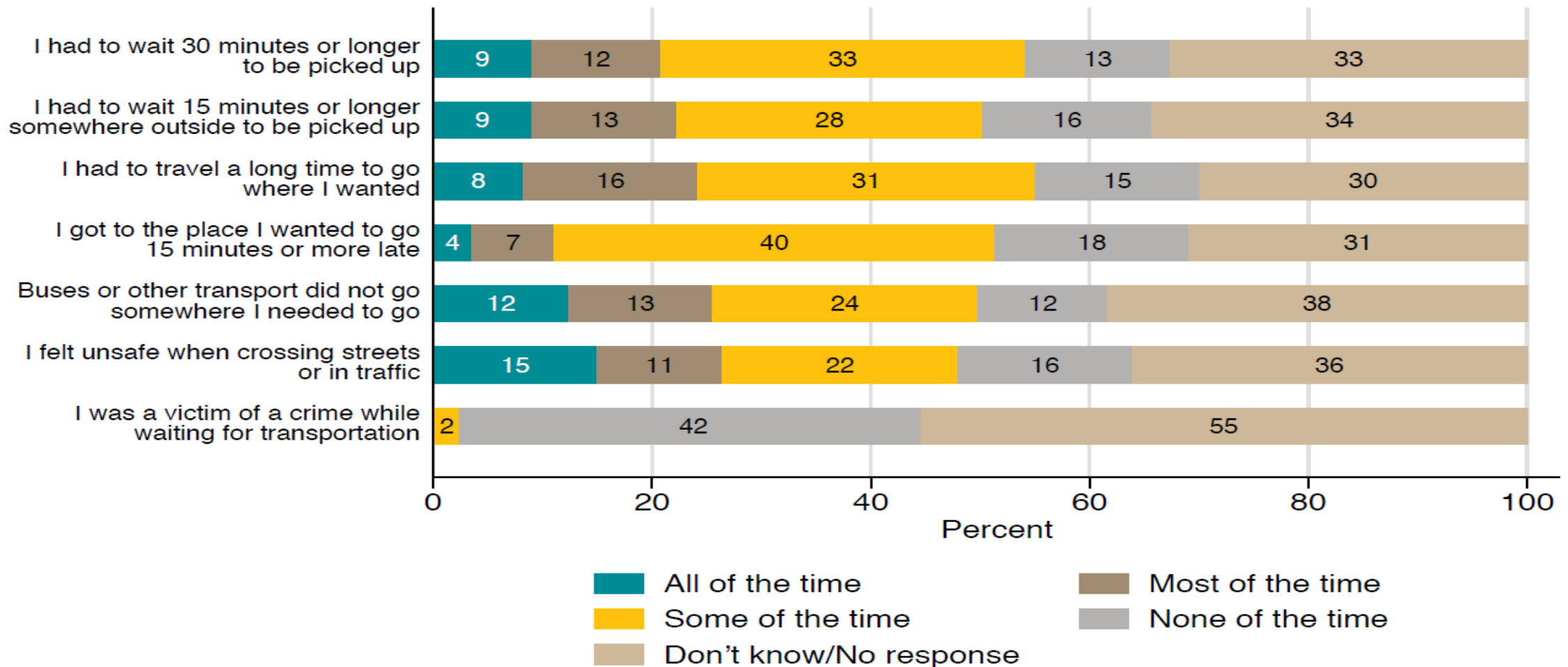


Figure 12: Percentage of respondents with disabilities who said they usually travel one of these ways

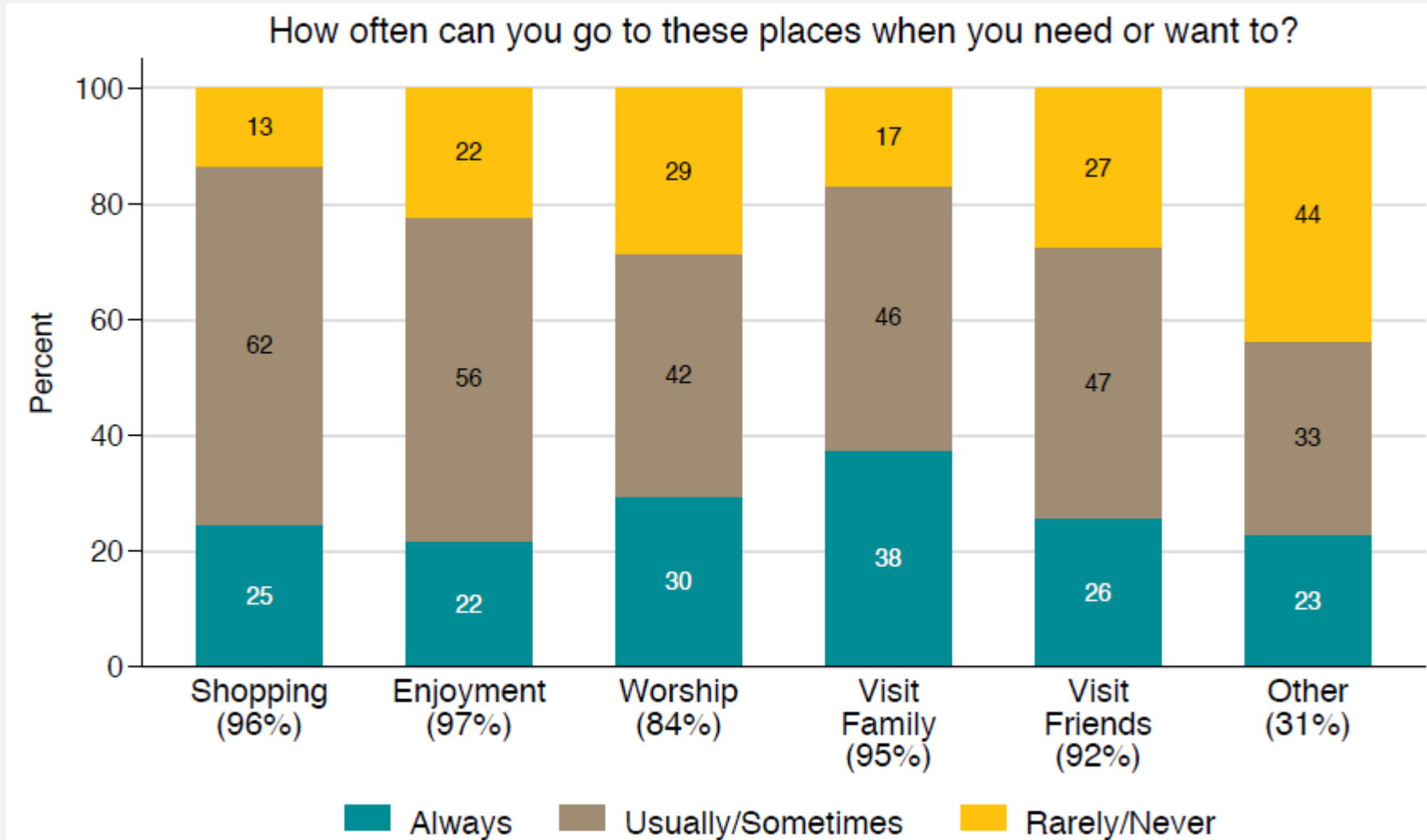

Figure 13: Respondents' with disabilities experiences while using transportation, part I

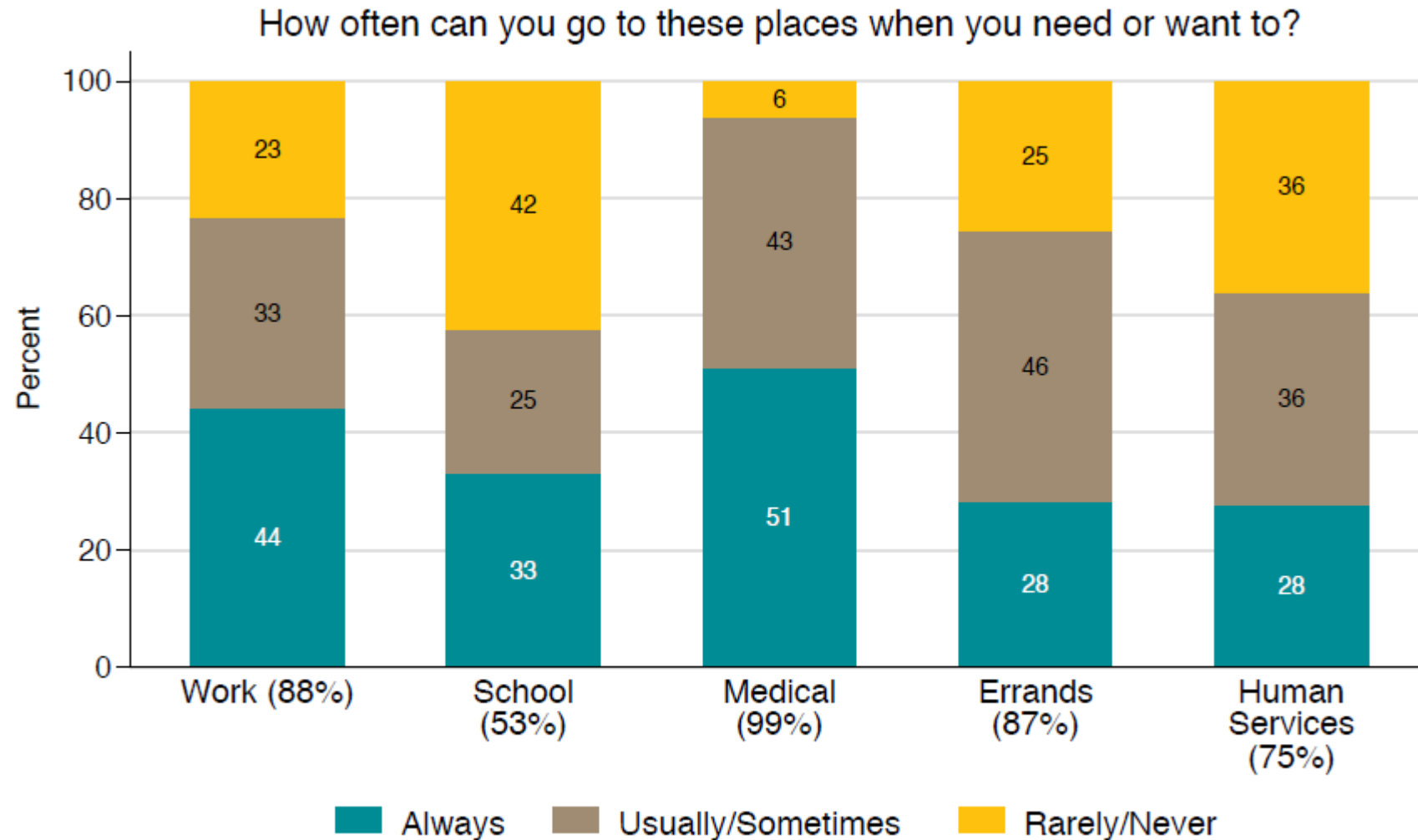
